




Dear Parents,

### Reading

Please encourage your children to read at home. Reading daily with adult support is crucial for your child to make good progress. This could be through listening to your child read or by reading more complex texts to them.

All reading done at home needs to be recorded regularly in your child's organiser. These will be monitored throughout the week.

Your child needs their reading book in school each day. This can be a book that they keep at school, or a book that they are currently reading at home. They are more than welcome to bring books from home.



### RE

In RE this term we will be studying Domestic Church (Family) with a focus: on Ourselves, Belonging to the church, Life Choices and Hope and Love in the run up to Christmas.

The children will also spend one week studying Judaism and one week study the Islamic Faith.

### Topic

The children will start the term learning about 'A Kingdom United'. Within this topic we will look at the historic origins of England with a focus on the Anglo-Saxons. We will also skip forward to modern day United Kingdom and study maps and famous landmarks. Our Literacy will link in with our Topic. It will focus on persuasive texts and myths and legends.




### Homework
