## Pupil Premium Impact 2015-16

The Pupil Premium was introduced by the Government in April 2011 as a means of providing additional funding to schools to address inequalities in attainment and progress between those children eligible for free school meals and those whose families who have higher income. Funding is received for pupils who were entitled to Free School Meals or have been in the last six years, are in public care or have been adopted from care.

This shows that children receiving funding through Pupil Premium

- Were working above the National Standard in reading, writing & maths
- Made more than expected progress from KS1 to KS2
- Made more progress from KS1 than other pupils in school in reading and slightly less in writing & maths.

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## How the funding was spent

Specialised Intervention including ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant)	£10,574	Most of this money was spent on individual teaching programmes as outlined in the schools Premium Passports. These focus on the areas for development and acknowledge the strengths. Pupil Premium pupils received individual and/or small group teaching. In addition the funding is used to support children and families through the Family Support Worker. This was used for on-going difficulties and specific interventions such as following bereavement.
School events & Trips	£633	This included the Pantomime and the Y6 residential to the Diocesan Centre at Crich. Other school trips were also funded through Pupil Premium
In School Clubs	£708	These included Magical Maths, Mad Science, Football Fitness & LCFC Football
Music Lessons	£630	Including Violin, Guitar & Keyboard
Out of school clubs	£754	These included Brownies and sports clubs
Uniform allowance	£325	£50 allowance for uniform per pupil
Additional costs	£37	Individual Pupil costs not included above
ICT	£3000	The school purchased i-pads to improve the IT provision in school
