Pupil Premium Grant Impact 2017-18

The Pupil Premium was introduced by the Government in April 2011 as a means of providing additional funding to schools to address inequalities in attainment and progress between those children eligible for free school meals and those whose families who have higher income. Funding is received for pupils who were entitled to Free School Meals or have been in the last six years, are in public care or have been adopted from care.

How the funding was spent

Targeted Interventions including ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant)	£30,131	Most of this money was spent on individual & group teaching programmes as outlined in the schools Premium Passports. These focused on the areas for development and acknowledged strengths. In addition the funding was used to support children and families through the Family Support Worker. This was used for on-going difficulties and specific interventions such as following bereavement.
School events & Trips	£1,708	This included the Pantomime and the Y6 residential to the Diocesan Centre at Crich. Other school trips were also funded through Pupil Premium for eligible pupils Funded: 75% of cost
Breakfast Club	£4,138	Supporting attendance and wellbeing Funded: 100% of cost
In School Clubs	£259	These included Magical Maths, Mad Science Funded: 75% of cost
Out of school clubs	£1,170	These included Brownies and sports clubs Funded: 75% of cost
Music	£886	Funded: 75% of cost
Uniform allowance	£1,148	£50 allowance for uniform per pupil
