Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Crimean War	(1853-1856) A war between Russia on one side and Britain, France, the Ottoman Empire (now Turkey) and Sardinia on the other.
battlefield	A place where soldiers fight in war.
First World War	(1914-1918) First World War or World War I.
chronological	Arranging something by the order they occurred in time.
equality	Equality is about ensuring that every individual has an equal opportunity to make the most of their lives and talents.
courageous	If you are a courageous person, you face danger or stand up against the odds without flinching.
compassion	Concern for the sufferings or misfortunes of others.
hospital	A building where doctors and nurses take care of people who are ill or injured.
nurse	Somebody who takes care of people who are sick or injured.
patients	People who are being looked after by nurses and doctors.
injured	Somebody who is hurt.
soldier	A person who is trained to fight in wars.
