Subject Specific Vocabulary	
<b>Crimean War</b>	(1853-1856) A war between Russia on one side and Britain, France, the Ottoman Empire (now Turkey) and Sardinia on the other.
<b>battlefield</b>	A place where soldiers fight in war.
<b>First World War</b>	(1914-1918) First World War or World War I.
<b>chronological</b>	Arranging something by the order they occurred in time.
<b>equality</b>	Equality is about ensuring that every individual has an equal opportunity to make the most of their lives and talents.
<b>courageous</b>	If you are a courageous person, you face danger or stand up against the odds without flinching.
<b>compassion</b>	Concern for the sufferings or misfortunes of others.
<b>hospital</b>	A building where doctors and nurses take care of people who are ill or injured.
<b>nurse</b>	Somebody who takes care of people who are sick or injured.
<b>patients</b>	People who are being looked after by nurses and doctors.
<b>injured</b>	Somebody who is hurt.
<b>soldier</b>	A person who is trained to fight in wars.
