The UK

The UK is made up of the island of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. The four countries of the UK are England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.

The UK is surrounded by the English Channel, the North Sea, the Irish Sea and the North Atlantic Ocean. The capital city of England is London.



Countries in the United Kingdom

England: England is the largest country in the UK. London is the capital city. Many parts of England are flat but there is also lots of rural countryside with rolling hills and valleys in the north. The patron saint of England is St George.

Scotland: Scotland is a country in the north of the UK. Edinburgh is the capital city. Scotland has large mountains including Ben Nevis, which is the largest in the UK. The patron saint of Scotland is St Andrew.

Northern Ireland: Northern Ireland is the smallest country in the UK. Belfast is the capital city. One of the most famous landmarks is Giant's Causeway (natural rock steps mostly hexagonal in shape). The patron saint of Northern Ireland is St Patrick.

Wales: Wales is a mountainous country in the west of the UK. Cardiff is the capital city. Wales has its own language (Welsh). Not everyone there speaks it though. The patron saint of Wales is St David.
